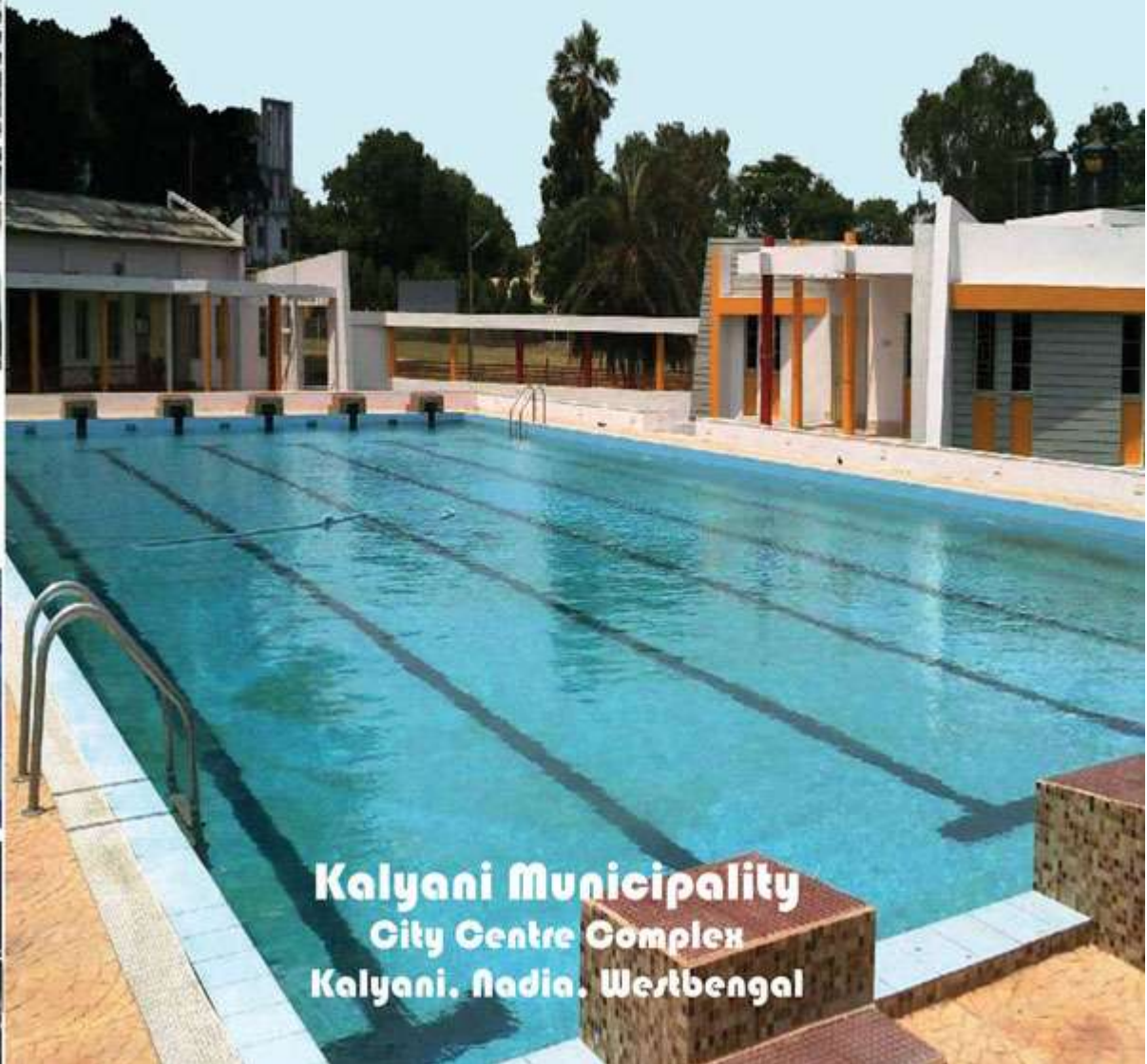

The great Santhal rebellion (1855) took place in eastern India against the British and land lords. The rebellion was led by the leadership of Murmu Brothers - Sidhu, Kanhu, Chand and Bhairav - congregated in the fields of Bhagna-Dihi. They took an oath to start 'Hool' or a revolt (30 June, 1855) - and was violently crushed by the British.

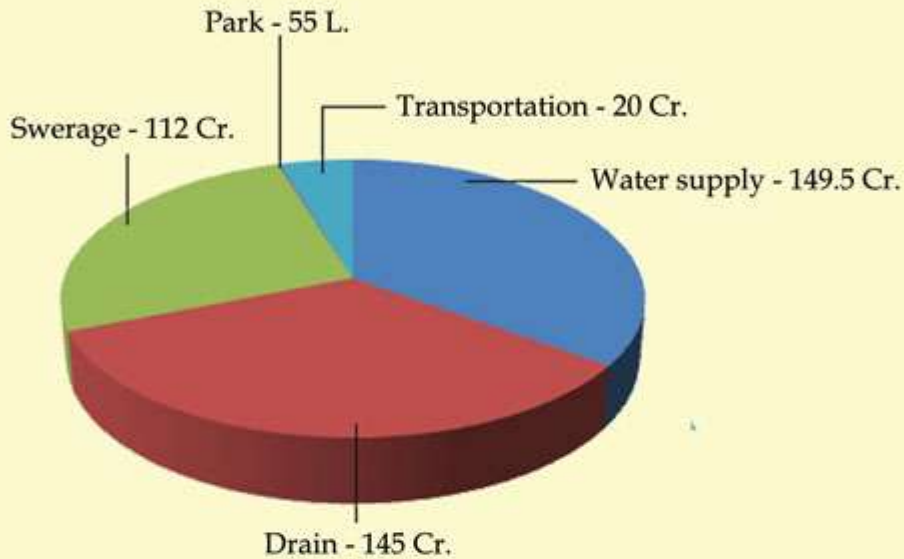

AMRUT

The Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development launched the "Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT)" on 9th June 2014. This municipality has been included under AMRUT.

The mission AMRUT seeks to address the following components :



As a first step the Service Level Improvement Plan (SLIP) has already been prepared covering all the sectors of AMRUT and submitted to the Govt. for approval.

The mission will support construction of houses upto 30 Sq. mt. under 'Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna (PMAY), the slogan is Housing For All (HFA) during 2015-2022.

The slogan 'Housing For All' envisages that every family in the country will have a pucca dwelling house with all civic facilities within 2022 - the year Nation celebrates 75 years of its Independence.

The ULB have already prepared an integrated city wide housing project of individual beneficiaries in accordance with the CDP. In a row this municipality targeted 864 no. of beneficiaries for the 1st year and submitted necessary documents to the Govt. for approval.

DISTRICT PROFILE - NADIA DISTRICT

Located in the central region of the state and surrounded by Bangladesh in the East, Hooghly and Bardhaman District in the West, Murshidabad in the North and North-West and, North 24 Parganas District in the South and the South-East.

Nadia is situated between 22.53° and 24.11° North latitude and 88.09° and 88.48° East longitude and about 3927 Sq. KMs. in Area, this district linear in shape. The Tropic of Cancer divides the district in two parts.

There is about: 230 KMs railway line passing through the district. Situated in main rail route connecting Howrah/Kolkata and New Jalpaiguri (NJP), the Nadia district can easily be accessed by rail. International Rail Link connecting India and Bangladesh passes through Nadia district with Gede as the last railway station at Indian Border.

Bifurcated by about 117 KMs National Highway-34 on the North and East. The Nadia district can also be accessed by road from other parts of the Country.

Nabadwip, Santipur & Fulia famous for its Handloom and other weaving activities.

Industrial Estates at Kalyani.

Matiary famous for bel metal works.
